Plan and teach lessons and other activities for children

Serve as part of a group to take turns providing age appropriate childcare during AAFM activities such as business meeting and committee meetings

Provide age appropriate religious education to youth each month, working collaboratively with young people and their parents to develop curriculum that helps youth explore their values and ideas in a Quaker context

Plan and lead monthly activities to support youth as they engage with AAFM and the larger community, may include field trips and overnight stays at the Friends' facilities.

Take AAFM teens to various Lake Erie Yearly Meeting teen events, such as November 15-17 in Athens, OH, and January 17-20 in Chicago, IL.

Provide child care at various other Meeting events, such as business meeting.
